Application for grant funding for Lulamisa Community Development Organisation NPO (Lulamisa) was submitted to NLC. On the application form the NPO requested an amount of R85 million for the purpose of "hosting the Commonwealth Games which would benefit the people of South Africa and boost the economy of the city of Durban".

3 July 2015

The application was approved for R80 million in NLC funding. The following members appear on the grant funding application that was submitted to the NLC: Mabundza (Chairperson), Malwandla Solly Siweya (Treasuren), Godfrey Junior Mageza (Deputy Chairperson), Khosa (Secretary) and Ntombizodwa Kwanile Mabunda (Deputy Secretary).

Mabundza signed the grant agreement on behalf of Lulamisa in his capacity as "Chairperson" and Charlotte Mampane signed on behalf of the NLC. In her capacity as Commissioner of the NLC. The grant agreement was witnessed by Siweya, one of the members of the hijacked Lulamisa NPO. Lulamisa was granted R80 million payable in two tranches of R64 million and R16 million respectively.

Lulamisa transferred an amount of R150 568.32 to bank account belonging to Iron Bridge Travelling Agency and Events. Lulamisa Further transferred an amount of R561 701.45. Iron Bridge Travel and Events owned by Rebotile Malomane. wife of former NLC COO Phillemon Letwaba.

NLC transferred the first tranche of R64 million to Lulamisa's bank account. Prior to receiving the transfer of R64 million from the NLC, Lulamisa's bank account had a credit balance of only R20,90.

According to the Department of Social Development (DSD) registered members of Lulamisa Community Development Organisation NPO are different to the ones that on the NLC application. The SIU has identified Lulamisa as a hilacked NPO.

Lulamisa also transferred an amount of R2 000 000.00 to Iron Bridge Travelling and Events, prior to this transfer, the company had R1 372 412.31 Iron Bridge Travelling and Events transferred an amount of R1 000 000.00 to a conveyancing attorneys towards thee purchase of the farm.

Konani Pfundzo Learning Centre submitted an application for grant funding to the NLC on 11 February 2016 for R49 935 697.52. The purpose of the request was to assist Tshikovha Graduate Academy, an NPC, for the project of drilling 200 boreholes in Limpopo, Mpumalanga, Northwest, Free State and Eastern Cape Provinces. On 19 February 2016, NLC awarded Konani Pfundzo Learning Centre grant funding of R55 463 735.

Konani Pfundzo and Tshikovha Graduate signed a memorandum that the grant will be transferred to Tshikovha Graduate within two working days.

Konani Pfundzo received grand funding from NLC, an amount of **R55 250 000** was transferred to the bank account of Tshikovha Graduate.

Redtaq transferred an amount of R2 4000 000.00 to conveyancing attorneys. Iron Bridge Travelling and Events transferred two amounts of R66 009.83 and R300 000.00 to the same conveyancing attorneys. These amount went towards the purchasing of the farm. Tshikovha further transferred an amount of R4 500 000.00 to Redtag.

Redtaq transferred an amount of R600 000.00 to Iron Bridge Travelling and Events.

Konani Pfundzo transferred an amount of R4 800 000.00 to a bank account belonging to a private company named Redtaq (pty) LTD. Karabo Charles Sithole is the sole director of Redtag and he is Philemon Letwaba's cousin.

Tshikovha transferred an amount of R8 000 000.00 to a bank account belonging to Mshandukani Holdings, before this transaction, Mshandukani Holdings had a total amount of R838 779.59 in their bank account. Mashudu Shandukani is the sole director of Mshandukani Holdings. Mshandukani Holdings transferred an amount of R1 000 000.00 to bank account of Ndzhuku Holdings. Before this transaction, Ndzhuku Holdings had R31 713.34 in its bank account. On the same day, Ndzhuku Holdings transferred an amount of R1 000 000.00 to conveyancing attorneys towards the purchasing of the farm. The Special Investigating Unit (SIU) has obtained an interdict from the Special Tribunal to stop the sale of a farm in Limpopo that is linked to the former National Lotteries Commission (NLC) Chief Operations Officer Phillemon Letwaba and his brother Johannes Letwaba.
