Technology Transfer

Technology transfer is an essential element of the capacitation of the state take over the operation of the National Lottery and involves the transfer or licensing of lottery technology, software, hardware and other lottery system components to the state. Applicants should provide a detailed plan for the transfer of technology and infrastructure to the state, which should be designed to ensure that the state can operate the National Lottery independently at the conclusion of the Licence Period. This plan should include a plan for providing technical support and maintenance services to the state after the transfer of technology and infrastructure is complete. Applicants should also provide a plan for ensuring the security and integrity of the National Lottery during the technology transfer process.

Applicants are encouraged to demonstrate ways in which the rights to an existing generic lottery system developed by a specialist lottery system developer, duly configured for local games and operations, may be acquired and transferred to the state at the end of the Licence Period. This may include, without limitation, the incorporation of a South African state-owned company which will, on commercial terms, acquire the rights to use, or own, the intellectual property rights to such a lottery system.
